Last Outing - Christmas on the Lake - Informal Get Together

The weather was kind to us up the lake during the Christmas break. A couple of Southerlies arrived just to keep us on our toes, however, northeasters prevailed for most of January and the weather and water temperature was great. Not a big year for boats on the lake but still a reasonable turn up of local and visiting boats. NSW Maritime and Water Police were quite active on the lakes with many skippers being breath tested. Our club groups were again centred at Blossom Bay and Neranie Sands/Kataway Bay, where many a Myall Sunset was admired during happy hours.

One noticeable fish story was impressed on yours truly whilst returning from a very enjoyable BBQ on "The Lodge" houseboat at Reedy Point on the top lake. A southerly change arrived around 9:30pm to spoil the party. Yours truly and the 1st Mate decided that a hasty retreat was in order so to navigate the 2.5 km trip in 20 knots from the south, back to our moored vessel in a pitch black, moonless night in our 2.6 mtr rubber duck. Halfway back, while crossing a sandbar with a southerly up our tail, I was hit quite significantly in the head by something unknown, followed by a scream from the 1st mate when she was also hit. Within seconds, I was hit again followed by the 1st mate getting clobbered again. Suddenly we heard considerable flapping within the duck and realised that we had been hit by flying mullet. Only one remained

in the boat, about 45cm long and guess who we had for breakfast the following morning. I always get my own back!
